July 2, 2023 - "Christ Comes" - #4 in the series Jesus in the Psalms

Texts Referenced: Psalm 98:1-9, Luke 2:25-32, John 14:1-3 NIV

- 1. What stood out to you about the message?
- Consider how Joy to the World, written in 1719 by Isaac Watts and largely associated with the Christmas season, was intended by the lyricist to be something other than a Christmas carol.
 - Why do you think this hymn found its way into the global canon of Christmas music?

3. Read Psalm 98:1-3

- Notice how this text uses the present perfect tense, indicating a past action that continues into the present - "has made his salvation known" and "has remembered his love and faithfulness to Israel."
- How do these verses help us better understand salvation as an ongoing act of rescue or providing aid?
- When is a memorable time you've been "rescued" and reminded of your salvation experience?

4. Read and Luke 2:25-32

- Why is Simeon's encounter with the infant Jesus critical to the Messiah prophesy and the salvation story?
- What can we learn from Simeon's example in our personal faith journey?

5. Read Psalm 98:4-9 and John 14:1-3.

- What images in these texts stand out as promises of triumph, rescue, and reconciliation at Jesus' final coming?
- How do the verses in Psalm 98 help you think about Isaac Watts' lyrics -Joy to the world, the Lord is come! - as not only a Christmas carol?
- 6. How can we pray for you?
