Vanity - Truth to Power: Esther

**Texts (NLT):** Esther 1: 1-4, 10-12, 19-20; Philippians 2: 3-4, Matthew 5: 5, 8

- 1. What stood out to you about the message?
- 2. Vanity the excessive pride in or opinion of oneself, their appearance, or achievements was a character trait of Xerxes, the Persian king from 485-465 B.C., who is featured in the story of Esther.
  - Where does vanity come from?
  - Why does vanity often not produce its intended outcome?
- 3. Read Esther 1: 1-4.
  - What might we infer from the duration of the lavish celebration?
  - What does the guest list suggest about the purpose of the banquet, which occurred 1-2 years before Xerxes' conquest of Greece?
- 4. Read Esther 1: 10-12.
  - What might we derive about Queen Vashti's role (v. 9) in Xerxes' court?
  - Why do you think Vashti refused to appear before her husband's guests?
- 5. Read Esther 1: 19-20.
  - What does the action taken by Xerxes say about the roots of his vanity?
  - How does this study of vanity resonate with you regarding current affairs?
- 6. Read Philippians 2: 3-4 and Matthew 5: 5, 8.
  - What do we learn from putting the interests of others before our own?
  - O How would you describe the meaning of "pure in heart," and do we achieve it?
- 7. How can we pray for you?
