Texts Referenced (NIV): John 2:13-22, Zecharaiah 7:10, James 1:19 (theme verse)

- 1. What stood out to you about the message?
- 2. In the Disney films *Inside Out* and *Inside Out 2*, Anger—a hot-headed little character —is an emotion that influences how young Riley responds to situations in her life.
 - What did you learn about anger growing up as a child?
 - How have your thoughts about anger changed, if at all?

3. Read John 2: 13-17.

- Jesus' actions can be described as *righteous indignation*—anger motivated by injustice.
 - Why do you think Jesus viewed the actions in the Temple as an injustice?
 - Are there examples of injustice in the church that also exist beyond its walls?
 - What is your experience seeing those injustices addressed?

4. Read John 2: 18-22.

- What does Jesus' dialogue with his disciples tell us about what motivated his actions?
- How do we determine if our anger is righteous indignation or a response to being personally offended? What's the difference?

5. Read Zecharaiah 7:10.

- In addition to these injustices, what other offenses would God not want us to condone?
- How does understanding righteous indignation help us focus on the outcomes of eliminating injustice reconciliation, repentance, and course correction?
