"Love Enemies" - #4 in the series In Good Faith: Our Love Is Our Witness

Texts Referenced (NLT): Matthew 5:43-48, Proverbs 25:21, Exodus 23:4-5, Luke 23:34

- 1. What stood out to you about the message?
- 2. Think about someone who always seemed to "have it in for you" as a kid.
 - Why do your memories about this person seem so clear even now?
 - How did your experience influence how you think about the idea of loving your enemies?

3. Read Matthew 5:43-45.

Loving our enemies - much less praying for them - seems counterintuitive. Many of us are reluctant even to identify others as our enemy.

- How do you describe someone who is an enemy?
- Why is it important to understand that "God gives his sunlight" to all of us, even to our enemies?

4. Read Matthew 5:46-48, Luke 23:34.

- What makes forgiving someone who has wronged or injured you so complicated seemingly impossible?
- How do you interpret Jesus' words, "You are to be perfect as your Father in heaven is perfect," in the context of loving your enemies?

5. Read Exodus 23:4-5, Proverbs 25:21-22.

- How do the examples of loving our enemies taking action also suggest a process of reconciliation?
- Is forgiveness without reconciliation possible? How?
