David - #4 in the series: God and the Underdogs - *God's Invitation to the Unqualified, Unsure, and Unseen*

Text Referenced (NIV): I Samuel 17:41-50; I Corinthians 15: 55-57

- 1. What stood out to you about the message?
- 2. In the 1986 film *Hoosiers*, a small-town high school basketball team wins the state championship against great odds, reminding us why stories about underdogs are inspiring and loved by so many.
 - Have you experienced a situation where you've been an underdog?
 - What were the challenges, and how did you navigate them?
 - How did being an underdog benefit you, if at all?

3. Read I Samuel 17: 41-44.

David is a teenager drawn into a deadly conflict between Israel and their persistent and more powerful enemy, the Philistines.

- In their face-to-face confrontation, what was Goliath's intent in demoralizing David?
- What are often the effects of verbal aggression on the victim? The aggressor?

4. Read I Samuel 17: 45-50.

David's response casts him not as an underdog - *unqualified*, *unsure*, *and unseen* - but someone who just might be up to the challenge.

- What happens when an underdog is victorious or triumphant?
- What other factors might we also attribute to David's victory over Goliath?

5. Read I Corinthians 15:55-58.

Recalling the words of the prophet Hosea, Paul reminds us that God's purpose is to defeat oppression - a call taken up by David against Goliath.

- Who are "the oppressed" the underdogs among us today?
- How can we respond to the needs of oppressed people in keeping with our faith?
- 5. How can we pray for you?
