Lament - #2 in the series: Ghosted - What To Do When God Seems Silent

Texts Referenced (NIV): Psalm 22: 1-2, 19-21, 22-24; Matthew 27:46

- 1. What stood out to you about the message?
- 2. *Lament* is a demonstrative expression of grief, pain, or sorrow and examples frequently appear throughout the Bible, including the Psalms.
 - What has been your understanding of lament?
 - Why might lament not be fully understood as a spiritual practice in the contemporary church?
- 3. The spiritual practice of lament includes the following four structural aspects:
 - Address *Directly addresses God*
 - Complaint *Voices the grief, pain, or sorrow*
 - Request Boldly asks God to do something
 - Trust Expresses the belief that God will respond
 - How does this structure help you understand that lament goes beyond making a complaint?

4. Read Psalm 22: 1-2, 19-21, 22-24.

- Can you identify the aspects of lament address, complaint, request, and trust?
- What does David's lament show us about his relationship with God?

5. **Read Matthew 27:46.**

- If Jesus lamented, why do we often resist it?
- How do you respond to the idea that lament is a prayer of pain that leads to trust?
- How is understanding the practice of lament helpful when God seems silent?
- 6. How can we pray for you?
